## **Indigenous Education 2024/2025**

Hello! My name is Natasha Gamache. I am the Indigenous Education Support Worker for Sparwood Secondary School. I would like to give a brief introduction to what our program is about. All students who identify themselves as being of Indigenous Ancestry are eligible for Support Services through the Indigenous Program. Examples of support: advocacy, communicating between home and school, home and community, classroom presentations, and student support. Every year students with Indigenous Ancestry (or parent/guardian) have not identified themselves as Indigenous because they mistakenly believe they need Status or Metis card. This is not the case. If you know that you or your children have

Indigenous Ancestry (First Nations, Metis, Inuit) your word is all that is required. Please share this information with others to help ensure all Indigenous students receive support/cultural opportunities. Please feel free to call or come in if you have any questions or concerns. Things to watch for: peer group, cultural field trips, class presentations, class fieldtrips, elder visits to our school and more.
