Principal's Message

Principal says: "Why did you do that?" Student responds: "I don't know". This question and response cycle is a large part of life as a principal. My hope at ESS is to hear less of "I don't know why I did that". Middle and Senior High is a great time for students to start learning how to act with intention. Senior high in particular is a time when students start on a path leading themselves towards the destination of their future career and life goals (scary to think of). Starting in grade seven students need to start thinking about: what they're putting into their bodies, how the way they are spending their time helps them reach their larger purposes, who they're spending time with, and what they're doing to contribute to their families, schools, and communities.

Students should prepare goals in the following areas:

- 1. Academics
- 2. Social life
- 3. Sports and exercise
- 4. Healthy eating
- 5. Family and community
- 6. Hobbies and interests
- 7. Screen time
- 8. Long-term plans

Students need help to set realistic short-term goals on the way to their long-term goal. Setting short term goals helps provide anchors for students in the tough world of being a teenager. Student need to learn how to separate the above areas, document progress, and create priorities. Remember, at this time in life lots of help needs to be provided to kids so they can learn how to meet goals. A sure way not to succeed is to try and make progress in too many areas at the same time, prioritizing is key. Three at a time should be the most. Documentation, conversation, learning, and celebration are all parts of learning how to set and achieve goals. Remember, slow and steady wins the race.

Tracking helps ensure that goals are not neglected. Kids need assistance in ensuring realistic steps to achievement. **SMART** goals can help with this: **Specific**, **Measureable**, **Attainable**, **Relevant**, and **Timely**.

Parents, now is the time to start having these conversations with your kids.

The metalwork students at Elkford have been practicing sand casting this term. The students have been designing their own objects and pouring molten aluminum into sand casted forms.








Senior Foods

THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/FEBRUARY!

School District #5 has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 7 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between: January 15th and February 21st, 2020.


