






Drama 8/9








Math 8

Is a class designed to prepare students for life after graduation. This includes a heavy focus on career opportunities. Students got an amazing opportunity to explore job opportunities at Teck through a tour of the Fording River mine site. Students explored multiple parts of the site including the mechanic shop, welding bays, and an overall site tour. Students got the chance to test their skills in a haul truck simulator. Many competed to see who could drive the truck the fastest and cause the most spectacular crashes. Finally, students received a very informative presentation about apprenticeships and post-secondary opportunities for jobs at Teck. It was a fantastic field

trip that gave many of our students a better understanding of opportunities available to them in the Elk Valley. A huge thank you to those at Fording River for hosting our students and providing them with a wonderful experience (and cool hats)!



It has been a busy month in the PE department. Students have been trying new activities, learning how to be safe in the outdoors as well as getting stronger. The PE department has also been enthusiastically supported by local groups.

Early in the month of November, students were able to go skating and curling. Elkford Curling Club supported the students with an introduction to curling, students learned how to throw their rocks, crash the house and land on the button. The volunteer coaches were Craig Robinson, Frank Trozzo, and Colleen Trozzo. Super grateful for the help and passion these volunteers shared with our students. Students also had the chance to go skating, where they moved with speed and grace with smiles for miles.

Later in the month, Avalanche Canada sent a certified instructor (Riccardo Tassuncao), to discuss avalanche safety, "The 5 Steps to Stay Safe," differing avalanche ratings according to avalanche.ca as well as the need take the AST 1. Students then had the chance to work hands on with the backcountry essentials (shovel, probe, and transceiver) and were run through search scenarios with the gear. With the senior PE class, Riccardo also had time to discuss his careers. He recently became a ski guide with Sorcerer Lodge after 10 years as an Operator with Elkview mine (from haul truck to shovel). He discussed the certifications and the practicums needed to get full time work in the adventure tourism industry. Students were respectful and polite with this hands-on presentation and discussions.

Students have also been developing their physical strength and tools to help with mental health. Students have been working in the weight room, learning form and technique with compound movements, plyometrics, core strength exercises as well as hitting the heavy bag and high intensity interval training (HITT). Students have additionally been introduced to a few supportive mental health tools, such as calming and strength yoga, along with variable mindfulness exercises. This month focussed on physical strength and mental well being. Great hustle everyone.

Finally, this month has been filled with local support for the PE program. A huge thankyou to Kelsey Hills and Tony Heather for their EPIC boxing/fitness donation to the Elkford Secondary School PE program. This equipment enriches and helps our fitness program and supports the interests of many students as well as introduces a new activity to the school community.

A big thank you to the United Steel Workers \$2000 donation. Bears Paw Contracting (\$500) and the Elkford Secondary PAC (\$350) donation to the upcoming rock-climbing adventure in Cranbrook.
