

A Busy March and April in PE: Avalanche Training at Fernie Alpine Resort (No Cost!), Snow Men, Curling, Skating, Cross-country skiing, Snowshoeing, Yoga/mindfulness, and Resistance Training.





On March 6th, Senior PE students went up to Fernie Alpine Resort for the first Senior PE Avalanche adventure. Students met up with a Ski Patroller who was their avalanche education mountain guide for the day. Students were taken up to the Avalanche Transceiver Training Area, where students practiced their searching with transceivers and probes. Students also went up to the White Pass Patrol Hut, where

students learned about the differing careers of working on the hill. Students saw patrollers "ski cutting," were able to see the avalanche cannon and its projectiles as well as meet Fenix, the avalanche dog. Students also had the opportunity to see avalanche terrain and past avalanches from a safe location, as well as see and identify crowns and breaks in the snow.

Students were also guided through the construction of snow pits, carving out columns and identifying weak layers in the snow. This

adventure was planned to give students an intrinsic connection to their learning and safety by making it hands on, in their extended community and with people from the Elk Valley.



This adventure was supported by many local groups (transportation costs), privates citizens and families (equipment) in Elkford. The Fernie Alpine Resort Summit Fund was the primary supporter of this enriched learning experience, covering the costs of lift passes, rentals, the time of the patrollers. This trip was cost free for all Senior PE Students wanting to go. Thank you to all who participated and supported this local place-based learning adventure.

Moving further into the months of March and April, the PE programming has been working towards fitness, that is local and within the community. The recreational activities are selected to reflect what students could do now and into their local future. Students have been out curling and skating. Grade 7 students learned the basics of cross-






country skiing and took a trip up to Bovin Cabin. Senior PE also had a chance to sharpen their skills and had a chance to ski up to the Water Tower and challenge

themselves down some of the terrain. There was also ample snow to venture into the mountains for various snowshoe expeditions. Students have also been in the weight room, working on fundamental compound movements, as well as core. Jogging was also introduced, small sections at a time, with one final 1.38km jog (all students loved it (a). As part of the fitness and conditioning segment, students have also been doing yoga and mindfulness in the gym, trying different exercises that could be used as mental health activities/tools into their future. PE has been diverse, working to support the interests of students as well as introducing students to






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MyEd Family Portal
