


Thanks to our entire school for helping us clean the community!

We ask that students do not bring gum to school.

Our custodians have noticed an increased amount of clean-up from improperly disposed of chewing gum.

Head lice have been reported in a few classrooms in our school. We appreciate parents letting us know when you have a concern. When it is reported we send a letter out to all families in the class while adhering to strict confidentiality.

While we do take it seriously, it is important to know to stay calm, head lice are a nuisance but do not cause disease. Please confirm that your child has an active case of head lice before starting treatment. Head lice are frequently "diagnosed" when in fact, they aren't there.

STUDENT LEARNING SURVEY 2023/2024 SURVEY IS OPEN UNTIL MAY 3, 2024

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size, and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in 2024 the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grade 4, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 3rd.
