- Place-based micro grants to schools to support place-based learning in K to 6 and place-based learning or outdoor education pursuits in grades 7 to 12
- Grounding of the District's Environmental and Outdoor Department through presenting at the 2025 Outdoor Learning Leaders Conference at Banff in October 2025
