## PRE-SERVICE TEACHING

## **Background**

The District is committed to supporting quality teacher education. To this end it encourages cooperation with teacher education institutions, authorizes the placement of pre-service teachers within schools in the District and will contribute to the administration of the teacher education programs offered within the District.

While pre-service teachers need the flexibility and the opportunity to learn, it is recognized that the education of the students in the class shall be of primary importance.

## **Procedures**

- 1. Administration and Staff
  - 1.1. Pre-service teachers shall not normally be used as Teachers Teaching on Call (TTOC). Where the pre-service mentor teacher is absent from teaching duties and/or supervision duties, a TTOC shall be provided and shall be responsible for the day's classes.
  - 1.2. Pre-service teachers shall be assigned only to teaching experiences for which they have specific training and/or background.
  - 1.3. Legal responsibility for student supervision, individual safety and classroom organization remains with the classroom teacher during a pre-service teacher's practical.
  - 1.4. Pre-service mentor teachers shall be held responsible for overall classroom management routines, instructional strategies, assessment, evaluation, and all other such duties and responsibilities as they relate to the classroom students.
  - 1.5. No pre-service teacher shall assume teaching responsibility for a class without plans for instruction approved by the Pre-service mentor teacher.
  - 1.6. Matching pre-service teachers and pre-service mentor teachers will be a collaborative process involving the teacher, pre-service teacher, school principal, District staff, and a representative from the educational institution.
  - 1.7. In cases where a pre-service teacher's assignment needs to be adjusted, this will be done so in collaboration between the pre-service teacher, the participating pre-service mentor teacher(s) and a representative of the educating institution.
  - 1.8. In secondary schools, an effort will be made to decrease the probability that a classroom student will have more than one pre-service teacher.
- 2. Selection of Pre-Service Mentor Teachers
  - 2.1. The Principal shall work with the Director of Student Learning and Innovation to liaise with teacher education institutions and facilitate teacher education experiences. The

- Director of Student Learning and Innovation has the final authority regarding the selection of pre-service mentor teachers
- 2.2. Pre-service mentor teachers are to have the equivalent of three (3) years full time teaching experience.
- 2.3. Teachers shall be given the opportunity annually to indicate their interest to their Principal in being a Pre-service mentor teacher or school coordinator.
- 2.4. A teacher who assumes the role of pre-service mentor teacher is strongly encouraged to attend in-service sessions as required to provide effective supervision and feedback for pre-service teachers.
