LET YOUR KIDS HELP WITH SPRING CLEANING (and other chores)

We get it: It's often easier to take out the trash yourself than to get your kid to do it.

Getting your kids to complete regular chores and tasks often feels like a chore in itself. But the weekly chores your kids do around the house can affect their future...and letting your kids take the easy road now will make it harder for them later.

It turns out that raising kids who grow up to be helpful, responsible, and community-minded starts with assigning them age-appropriate household chores in their early years. (Not sure which chores are age-appropriate? <u>CLICK FOR A FREE RESOURCE!</u>

A Wall Street Journal <u>study</u> found that doing chores as a child is a strong predictor of whether someone will choose to volunteer or give back as an adult. Similarly, <u>a study</u> from the University of Mississippi found that kids who start helping around the house as toddlers tend to be more successful in their 20s. Why? Because those small tasks teach big lessons—like responsibility, teamwork, empathy, and independence.

- So, it's not just about getting your kids to do their chores.
- It's about training them to help others and look for opportunities to contribute.
- It's about using your home as a place to teach your kids the power of initiative.
- It's about helping kids move toward building their own families and developing positive personal habits
- Initiative will be an important part of your kid's success, and that can start at home. So the next time your little one grumbles about setting the table, remember: you're not just assigning a chore, you're shaping their future.


If you would like to volunteer for Hot Lunch days, please come to the kitchen for 11:00 am.


