Hello Parents/Guardians.

The students at Highlands are working very hard to prepare this year's Christmas Musical, "Survivor at the North Pole". The musical will be held on <u>Wednesday, December 18th at the Key City Theatre at 6:30pm</u>, with a dress rehearsal in the afternoon. On the reverse side of this letter, you will find specifics regarding what each class is being asked to wear for the musical. Students are asked to wear their costumes for the dress rehearsal in the afternoon. They will have the opportunity to change into costume before loading the bus if you prefer that your child not wear the costume for the morning.

Grade 6 students who have acting roles will be given specific instructions as to what they will need to wear.
