Mission is to nourish students with food and friendship

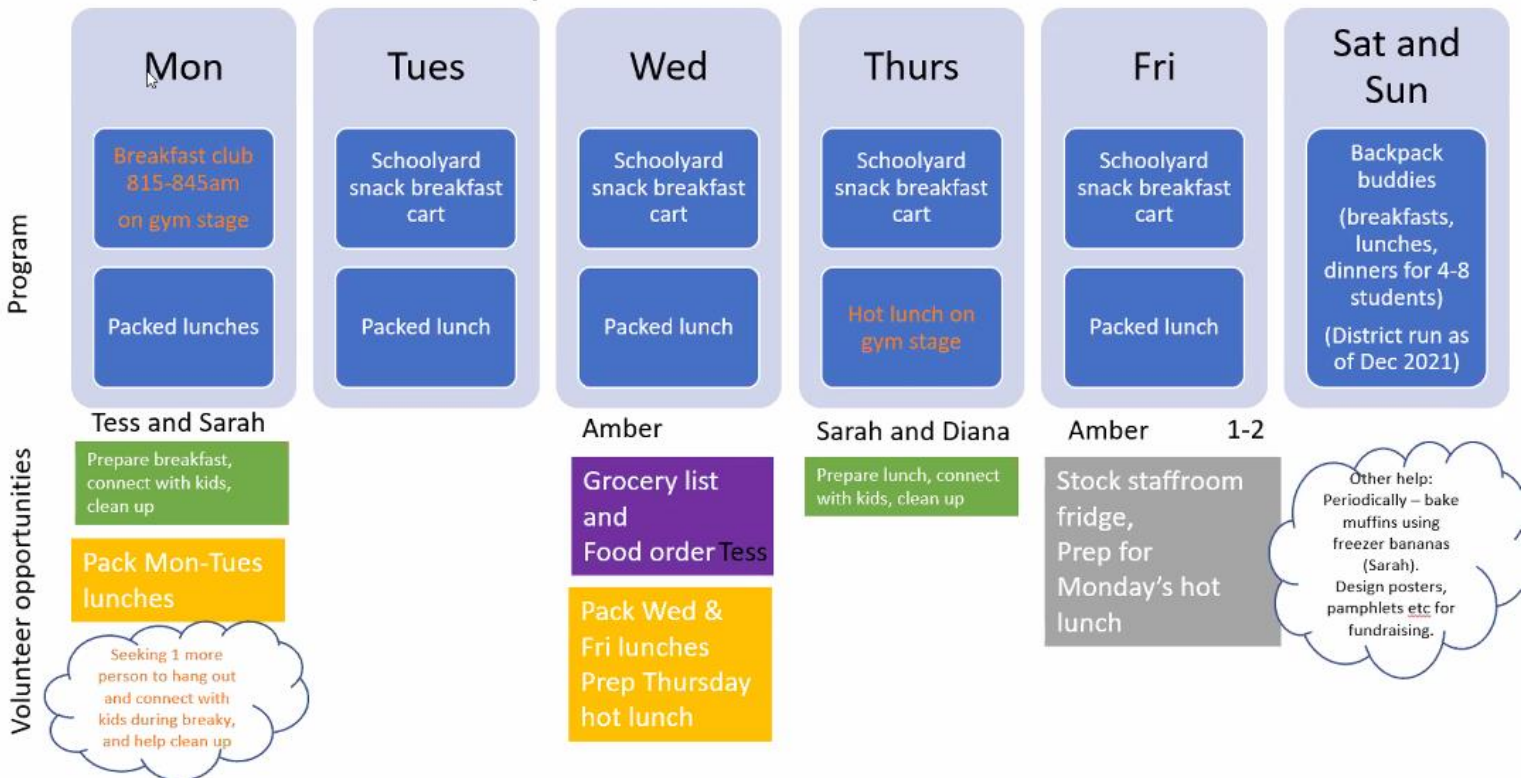
Hope to spread the load from youth care workers with volunteers and help free youth care workers to be with kids
