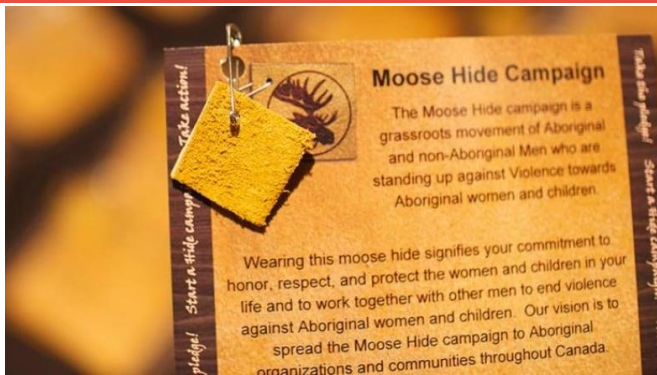

La Pouchinn Raazayn

Raisin Pudding With Sauce

- 1 cup Flour (la farin)
- 2 tsp Baking Powder (poodr a pate)
- 1/8 tsp Salt (li sel)
- 2 TBSP Butter (li beur)
- 2 TBSP Sugar (li seuk)
- 1 cup Raisins (dii raazayn)
- 1/2 cup Milk or Cream (enn bol dilet/krem)
- 1 cup Brown Sugar (li seuk brun)
- 1 TBSP Butter (li beur)
- 1 3/4 cup Boiling Water (dii loo)

Mix flour, sugar, salt, baking powder, and raisins. Melt butter (2 TBSP) and mix with milk. Stir wet ingredients into dry ingredients until just mixed.

Spread the mixture into a greased baking dish.

Boil water and add butter (1 TBSP) and brown sugar. Stir then pour over the mixture in the baking dish.

Bake at 350 degree F for 30 min. Allow the pudding to cool for 15-30 min before serving (this allows the sauce to thicken).



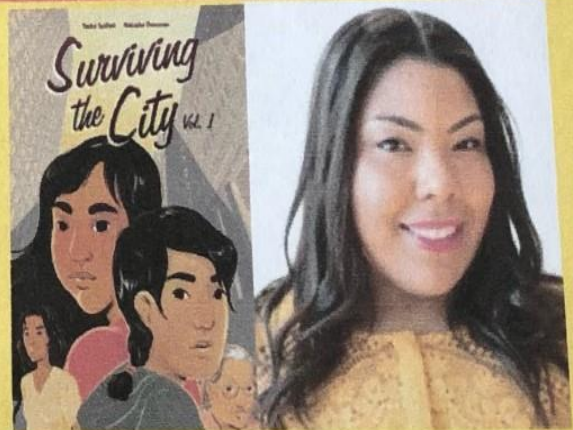
