- 4. Teacher adapted content and assessment in Brightspace
- 5. Implement the Pacing and Progress tool in Brightspace

SCHOOL GROWTH PLAN PRIORITIES K-9

Priority: Increase student success, through course *engagement*, in obtaining credits at KDS in all required areas of learning in an educational program in pursuit of graduation within School District Number 5.

Goal:

K-9: Support student engagement so that students demonstrate a level of proficiency, on the B.C. Proficiency Scale, in at least 75% of competencies and content in all subjects. This will result in an improvement in alignment of assessment and curriculum and ultimately lead to assessment that better reflects student learning and progress.

Strategies:

- 1. Targeted Brightspace Pro-D
- 2. Teacher adapted course content
- 3. Creation of Brightspace departments (elementary, middle, and secondary)
- 4. Weekly check-is with online student
- 5. Alignment between curriculum and assessment through competency based assessment.


KDS is working towards showing a clear focus and attention on First Nations and Indigenous students.
