

CROSS COUNTRY RUNNING



When to Call the Police: 911 vs. Non-Emergency

The Cranbrook RCMP non-emergency line is 250-489-3471. It offers a 24 hours a day - 7 days a week line to call takers that create police file reports. Outside of our local office hours (Monday to Friday 8am-4pm) the line will connect you to our non-emergency dispatch call center. If you call outside of office hours please remain on the line and follow the prompts to be connected to a call taker.

Knowing who to call can make a big difference:

Call 911 if something dangerous is happening right now, situations where someone is getting hurt, a fight in progress, or any situation where safety is at risk or weapons are involved.

Call the Cranbrook RCMP non-emergency line if it is not urgent but still important, situations like threats made online after school, vandalism, or suspicious activity.

<u>Please remember</u>: If something happens off school grounds and outside school hours, students and parents should report it directly to police, not the school. The school can offer support afterward, but police need to be the first to know.

Let's enrich our school community. By joining CPF, families help create more opportunities for students to experience French language and culture in meaningful ways.



November is Metis Appreciation Month

The Métis are a distinct Indigenous people of Canada with a unique cultural heritage resulting from unions between First Nations women and European men, primarily fur traders. The first fur traders in Canada were French fishermen and explorers in the early 1500s. The Metis developed their own customs, language, and way of life, and are recognized as one of Canada's three Indigenous peoples alongside First Nations and Inuit. Métis communities are historically concentrated in a region often called the Métis Homeland, which includes parts of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta, Ontario, and British Columbia (In the US, Montana, North Dakota, and Minnesota).
