

Project 529 October 8th @ 11am – 3:30pm and October 9th @ 2:30pm – 4pm

We are very excited to be launching our partnership with the Provincial Government and Project 529 by bringing the "529 Garage App" to Cranbrook. We look forward to having your students and staff have their bikes registered! Here is a little information about the program:

What is Project 529 and 529 Garage?

529 Garage is a free app that registers your bike and makes it easier to recover and return to you if it is ever stolen. The 529 app gives police the tools to identify stolen bikes faster and get them returned to their rightful owners.

How it works:

Download the free app and register your bike with its make, model, serial number, and photos. If your bike is ever stolen, you have a well documented record for police and can send an alert that instantly notifies the cycling community to be on the look out.

The 529 Shield:

Is an additional layer of protection. Each registered bike can utilize a tamper-resistant shield decal, linking your bike to its registration. It's a visible warning to thieves that your bike is registered and a powerful tool to help get stolen bikes back where they belong. The shield allows officers to quickly scan the QR code and know if the bike is in the possession of its rightful owner or not.

What we are doing together:

Cranbrook RCMP has purchased shields and we'll be giving them out free of charge to registered bikes at our detachment and at upcoming bike registration events. Bring your bike down, and we'll help you get set up on the app and equipped with your shield.

With police and community working side by side, we can protect what's ours, the more bikes that are registered the harder it is for thieves to operate here.

Students and Faculty are encouraged to bring their bike to school on the specific dates, noted below, where RCMP will be on site at your school to register bikes.

Alternatively, if you are not able to bring your bike to school on the scheduled date(s) you are encouraged to download the app, photograph and register your information, then bring your bike to the Cranbrook RCMP detachment for a shield. If you would like assistance registering, you can bring your bike down to the Cranbrook RCMP detachment and someone from Community Policing would be happy to help you out.

YOUTH CARE SERVICES

Parkland Middle School offers full-time Youth Care Services to provide various levels of support for students and families. Miss Robin and Miss Kelly are our Youth Care Worker team who help facilitate programs and services including, but not limited to:

- · Social emotional support and well-being
- · Referrals to community supports and services
- · Life skills groups
- · Access to basic needs items (clothing, hygiene supplies, school supplies, etc.)
- · Student food support includes facilitation of our breakfast, nutrition break, and lunch programs
- · Family food support including Backpack Buddies and Food Recovery
- · Communication between students, parents, and teachers
- · Support with academic and organization skills

Students needing a place to eat breakfast or lunch can join Miss Robin or Miss Kelly in the Youth Care Services room. Both have their Food Safe Certification and aim to provide healthy, nutritious snacks and meals for students.

Food access is available for everyone, whether it be an ongoing need, on a day when lunch may be forgotten, or they feel they need a little more! We have fruits and vegetables available daily, and a variety of other options such as cheese, yogurt, granola bars, crackers, toast, cereal, bagels, cream cheese, and more!

Every child is welcome, and the youth care space is a great place to connect with others. Parents are welcome to call, email, or stop by the Youth Care offices at any time to discuss their children's needs.

Fair Notice and Process

Student safety is a priority in School District No. 5 (Southeast Kootenay). To help keep our students and staff safe, we are part of a regional protocol that governs our plans for responding to situations where we believe students may be posing a threat to themselves or others. This Violence Threat/ Risk Assessment Protocol is signed by all regional school districts, as well as the RCMP and the Ministry of Child and Family Development. Many of our district and school personnel are trained to be on Threat Assessment Teams and have experience in behavioural and digital threat assessments.
