

## SSS Course Selection Cheat Sheet - Right, Left, Up, A, B, Start

MyEd is used for course selection and reports cards. You should ensure you record and keep safe your username and password. You will need this several times each year. You access MyEd as a link on your SD5 Portal.

### Student MyEd

**Username:** sd5stu-firstinitiallastname (sd5stu-mkelly)

**Password:** Record and keep safe. There is an option on MyEd to click if you forgot your password. If you are still stuck, you need to see Karen or Jenn at the office. They will reset your password and an email will be sent to your school email (studentnumber@sd5.bc.ca).

Effective the 2023/24 school year, all students working toward a B.C. Certificate of Graduation ("Dogwood Diploma"), in English or French, must successfully complete at least 4 credits in Indigenous-focused coursework. This requirement applies to students in B.C. public, independent, First Nations, and offshore schools. There is no change to the total number of credits required to graduate, which remains at 80.
